FORGOTTEN HISTORY

- Humanity has been subject to strange celestial manifestations throughout history.
 - ► Aerial phenomena and angelic beings.
 - Humans carried off by fiery chariots in the sky.
- Livy's "Ab urbe condita" (27-9 BCE) recorded portents in the year 218 BCE:
 - "navium speciem de caelo adfulsisse" ("phantom ships had been seen gleaming in the sky").
- Plutarch's "Lucullus" (c. 100 CE):
 - "... on a sudden the sky opened, and a large luminous body fell down in the midst between the armies, in shape like a hogshead, but in colour like melted silver... This wonderful prodigy happened in Phrygia, near Otryae."



"At first there appeared in the middle of the sun two blood-red semi-circular arcs, just like the moon in its last quarter. And in the sun, above and below and on both sides, the color was blood, there stood a round ball of partly dull, partly black ferrous color."

"Likewise there stood on both sides and as a torus about the sun such blood-red ones and other balls in large number, about three in a line and four in a square, also some alone..."






BASEL. 1566

"It happened in 1566 three times, on 27 and 28 of July, and on August 7, against the surrise and sunset; we saw strange shapes in the sky above Basel."

"At the dawn of August 7, we saw large black spheres coming and going with great speed and precipitation before the sun and chattered as if they led a fight. Many of them were fiery red and, soon crumbled and then extinguished."

WASHINGTON, D.C. 1952.



- Seven flying objects detected on radar moving rapidly over Washington, D.C.
- Observed by pilots as "white, tailless, fast-moving lights".
- "... their movements were completely radical compared to those of ordinary aircraft."





RENDLESHAM FOREST INCIDENT. RENDLESHAM FOREST, UK. 1980.

- Series of reported sightings of strange lights near Rendlesham Forest, Suffolk in late December 1980, close to RAF Woodbridge - a base being used by the US Air Force.
- "Servicemen initially thought it was a downed aircraft but, upon entering the forest to investigate they saw... what they described as a glowing object, metallic in appearance, with coloured lights."
- "The UK Ministry of Defence has stated the event posed no threat to national security, and therefore, it was never investigated as a security matter."

Arthur Rackham - Pandors

- Reported crash and recovery of debris from a "flying saucer" near Corona, New Mexico.
 - ► Gathered by personnel from nearby Roswell Army Air Field.
 - ▶ Initially claimed to be a weather balloon and, eventually, a high-altitude surveillance balloon as part of US Project Mogul.
- Later interviews with participants claimed the materials as "nothing made on this earth".
- Associated with a wave of over 800 related sightings in 1947.








PROJECT BLUE BOOK

- Systematic study of UFO phenomena in the US from 1952-1969.
- Chiefly concerned with national security implications of UFO reports.
- Concluded by the Condon Report in 1968, drawing on both civilian and Blue Book data; concluded that the study of UFOs was unlikely to result in significant scientific discoveries.

PROPOSAL: PARANORMAL DATA SCIENCE

- Past studies of UFOs, UAPs, and similar fringe phenomena, have been largely qualitative.
 - Focus on deep, but narrow, analysis of individual cases.
- Despite our primordial fear of the unknown, we can apply emerging statistical tools to large citizen science datasets.

- Several citizen science projects have gathered UFO reports dating back to the 1950s, particularly in the US.
 - ▶ National Investigations Committee On Aerial Phenomena (NICAP).
 - Mutual UFO Network (MUFON).
 - ► National UFO Reporting Center (NUFORC).
- NUFORC is relatively comprehensive, and convenient to scrape.







EXPLORATORY VISUAL ANALYSIS

- In exposing our minds to any dataset, no matter how horrifying, visualisation is an important initial step.
- Immediately establish a tremulous feel, and dread terror, of the world into which we have chosen, recklessly, to plunge.


SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION





Density of UFO Sightings in the United Kingdom @WeirdDataSci | https://www.weirddatascience.net









THE SHAPE OF THE OTHER


- Unidentified Aerial Phenomena have been reported in a wide variety of shapes and sizes throughout history.
- Plutarch's silvery "pithos", or wine-jar; to the now-dreaded flying saucer; and beyond.
 - ▶ Do alien craft shift and evolve over time?
- NUFORC logs the reported shape of its sightings.

INFERENTIAL STATISTICS

- Simple descriptive statistics can only take us so far in our descent into madness.
- Inferential statistics twist and distort raw observations to predict future phenomena.
- Two major schools of inferential statistics.
 - ▶ Frequentist statistics have dominated the last century,
 - Bayesian statistics provide an increasingly popular alternative.

BAYES THEOREM



Rev. Thomas Bayes

Bayes' theorem is a tool to update our beliefs in the presence of data.

$$\mathtt{P}(\theta|\mathtt{Data}) = \frac{\mathtt{P}(\mathtt{Data}|\theta)\mathtt{P}(\theta)}{\mathtt{P}(\mathtt{Data})}$$

$${\tt Posterior} = \frac{{\tt Likelihood} \times {\tt Prior}}{{\tt Evidence}}$$

Fundamental result in probability theory; core to Bayesian inference.





BAYESIAN WHISPERINGS

Bayesian inference, and its philosophical approach to hidden values, provides a number of advantages.

- Easy incorporation of new data a posterior becomes a prior as new evidence arrives.
- Results are a full probability distribution over chilling unknowns, not point estimates.
- Lends itself to hierarchical models, in which correlated phenomena become locked in insidious mutual influence.

- Significant computational effort is required to determine the evidence, or "marginal likelihood", term.
- Computational approaches fit models by arcane explorations of the multidimensional space of hyperparameters.
- Probabilistic programming languages convert a statistical model to code.




DREAD EXPERIMENTS

- How, then, do dread glimpses of pan-dimensional reality relate to human populations?
 - Do extraterrestrial visitors favour one location over another, regardless of human habitation?
 - As human populations grow, to what extent are interstellar visitors drawn to them?
- A series of mathematical models of increasingly deranged complexity to peel back the indescribable veil of this unsanctioned experimentation.
 - More specifically, from naive linear regressions to weirdly complex generalized linear models (GLM).







Casting aside the stifling simplicity of the Normal distribution, we recklessly embrace the complexities of a more subtle and flexible accounting.




Further twisting our statistical model, we allow data from each state to subtly influence the horrifying predictions of others, creating a partially-pooled model:
